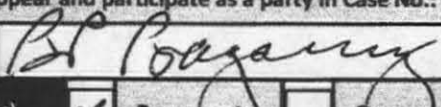

PARTY WITNESS INFORMATION:

- 1. A list of witnesses who will testify on the party's behalf:**
 - a. Bruce P. Baganz, President, Board of Trustees of The Textile Museum, and President of The Textile Museum, a Washington, DC not for profit corporation.
 - b. W. Richard West, Interim Director of The Textile Museum

 - a. Testimonies will stress the importance of the GW/Textile Museum affiliation and the benefits to The George Washington University ("University"), the neighborhood, and the District of Columbia.
- 3. An indication of which witnesses will be offered as expert witnesses, the areas of expertise in which any experts will be offered, and the resumes or qualifications of the proposed experts (*Zoning Commission only*):**
 - a. The witnesses will not be testifying as expert witnesses.
- 4. The total amount of time being requested to present your case (*Zoning Commission only*):**
 - a. 10 minutes

PARTY STATUS CRITERIA:

- 1. How will the property owned or occupied by such person, or in which the person has an interest be affected by the action requested of the Commission/Board?**
 - a. The Textile Museum is affiliating with the applicant and will utilize the proposed project for display of its own collections, collections from other museums, and third party collections.
- 2. What legal interest does the person have in the property? (i.e. owner, tenant, trustee, or mortgagee)**
 - a. The Textile Museum currently owns its property at 2320 S Street NW, but will transition its operations to this property pursuant to an agreement with the University.
- 3. What is the distance between the person's property and the property that is the subject of the application before the Commission/Board? (Preferably no farther than 200 ft.)**
 - a. The Textile Museum is currently located approximately 1.6 miles from the property that is subject of the application before the Commission. However, The Textile Museum will relocate its operations to the property that is subject of the application before the Commission.
- 4. What are the environmental, economic, or social impacts that are likely to affect the person and/or the person's property if the action requested of the Commission/Board is approved or denied?**
 - a. The Textile Museum will benefit from a new, centrally located facility that is designed to enhance its ability to conduct the operations required by its mission which encompasses art, scholarship, education and cultural understanding

- 5. Describe any other relevant matters that demonstrate how the person will likely be affected or aggrieved if the action requested of the Commission/Board is approved or denied.**
 - a. If the Commission denies the project, The Textile Museum will need to reconsider options for new facilities.
- 6. Explain how the person's interest will be more significantly, distinctively, or uniquely affected in character or kind by the proposed zoning action than that of other persons in the general public.**
 - a. As stated earlier, The Textile Museum is affiliating with the applicant and will transfer its operations as a cornerstone of the museum pursuant to an agreement with the University.
