3. This license and the Certificate of Occupancy or Home Occupation Permit for the premises, or equivalent proof that the premises complies with all applicable Federal and District of Columbia fire, safety, building, and zoning regulations and codes shall be posted together at a conspicuous place on the licensed premises.
