Application No. 18456 of West End Residential Properties, LLC, on behalf of the District of Columbia, pursuant to 11 DCMR §§ 3104.1 and 3103.2, for a variance from the public space requirements under § 633, a variance from the court requirements under § 638, a variance from the off-street parking requirements under § 2101.1, and a variance from the loading requirements under § 2201.1, and a special exception under § 411.11 from the roof structure provisions under §§ 411.5 and 630.4, to allow a mixed-use project that consists of a new fire station at the ground level, recreational or commercial use, and an apartment house in the CR District at premises 2225 M Street, N.W. (Square 50, Lot 822).

SUMMARY ORDER

The Board of Zoning Adjustment (the "Board") provided proper and timely notice of the public hearing on this application by publication in the *D.C. Register* and by mail to the Applicant, Advisory Neighborhood Commission ("ANC") 2A, and to all owners of property within 200 feet of the property that is the subject to this application. The subject property is located within the jurisdiction of ANC 2A, which is automatically a party to this application. ANC 2A submitted a letter in support of the application, dated November 16, 2012. The ANC indicated in its letter report that at a duly noticed, regularly scheduled monthly meeting on November 14, 2012, with a quorum present, the ANC voted unanimously (4:0:0) to approve the application. (Exhibit 25).

The Office of Planning ("OP") submitted a timely report dated November 27, 2012, recommending approval of the requested areas of relief. (Exhibit 27). At the hearing, the District Department of Transportation did not express an objection to the approval of the application. Susan B. Haight, on behalf of the West End Library Friends, submitted a letter and request for party status in support of the application. At the hearing, Ms. Haight withdrew her party status request and testified in support of the application. (Exhibit 24). Howard Biel, on behalf of The Residences at Ritz-Carlton, submitted a letter in support of the application. (Exhibit 28).

Variance Relief:

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BOARD OF ZONING ADJUSTMENT
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As directed by 11 DCMR § 3119.2, the Board required the Applicant to satisfy the burden of proving the elements that are necessary under § 3103.2, to establish the case for variances from the public space requirements under § 633, from the court requirements under § 638, from the off-street parking requirements under § 2101.1, and from the loading requirements under § 2201.1. No parties appeared at the public hearing in opposition to the application. Accordingly, a decision by the Board to grant this application would not be adverse to any party.

Based upon the record before the Board, and having given great weight to the ANC and OP reports filed in this case, the Board concludes that the Applicant has met the burden of proving under 11 DCMR § 3103.2 that there exists an exceptional or extraordinary situation or condition related to the property that creates a practical difficulty for the owner in complying with the Zoning Regulations, and that the requested relief can be granted without substantial detriment to the public good and without substantially impairing the intent, purpose, and integrity of the zone plan as embodied in the Zoning Regulations and Map.

Special Exception Relief:

As directed by 11 DCMR § 3119.2, the Board also required the Applicant to satisfy the burden of proving the elements that are necessary to establish the case pursuant to §§ 3104.1 and 411.11 for a special exception from the roof structure provisions under §§ 411.5 and 630.4. No parties appeared at the public hearing in opposition to the application. Accordingly, a decision by the Board to grant this application would not be adverse to any party.

Based upon the record before the Board and having given great weight to the ANC and OP reports filed in this case, the Board concludes that the Applicant has met the burden of proof, pursuant to 11 DCMR §§ 3104.1, 411.11, 411.5, and 630.4 that the requested relief can be granted as being in harmony with the general purpose and intent of the Zoning Regulations and Map. The Board further concludes that granting the requested relief will not tend to affect adversely the use of neighboring property in accordance with the Zoning Regulations and Map.

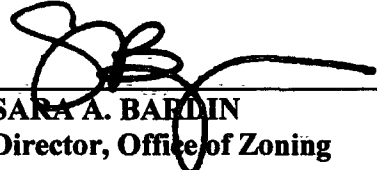

It is therefore **ORDERED** that the application is hereby **GRANTED**, **SUBJECT TO the revised plans dated November 19, 2012 at Exhibit 26.**

PURSUANT TO 11 DCMR § 3125.9, NO ORDER OF THE BOARD SHALL TAKE EFFECT UNTIL TEN (10) DAYS AFTER IT BECOMES FINAL PURSUANT TO § 3125.6.

PURSUANT TO 11 DCMR § 3130, THIS ORDER SHALL NOT BE VALID FOR MORE THAN TWO YEARS AFTER IT BECOMES EFFECTIVE UNLESS, WITHIN SUCH TWO-YEAR PERIOD, THE APPLICANT FILES PLANS FOR THE PROPOSED STRUCTURE WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF CONSUMER AND REGULATORY AFFAIRS FOR THE PURPOSE OF SECURING A BUILDING PERMIT, OR THE APPLICANT FILES A REQUEST FOR A TIME EXTENSION PURSUANT TO § 3130.6 AT LEAST 30 DAYS PRIOR TO THE EXPIRATION OF THE TWO-YEAR PERIOD AND THAT SUCH REQUEST IS GRANTED. NO OTHER ACTION, INCLUDING THE FILING OR GRANTING OF AN APPLICATION FOR A MODIFICATION PURSUANT TO §§ 3129.2 OR 3129.7, SHALL EXTEND THE TIME PERIOD.

PURSUANT TO 11 DCMR § 3125, APPROVAL OF AN APPLICATION SHALL INCLUDE APPROVAL OF THE PLANS SUBMITTED WITH THE APPLICATION FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF A BUILDING OR STRUCTURE (OR ADDITION THERETO) OR THE RENOVATION OR ALTERATION OF AN EXISTING BUILDING OR STRUCTURE. AN APPLICANT SHALL CARRY OUT THE CONSTRUCTION, RENOVATION, OR ALTERATION ONLY IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE PLANS APPROVED BY THE BOARD AS THE SAME MAY BE AMENDED AND/OR MODIFIED FROM TIME TO TIME BY THE BOARD OF ZONING ADJUSTMENT.
