APPLICATION

Pursuant to *Title 11 DCMR §§3103.2*, the *Applicant* requests a variance from the lot occupancy requirements listed under §403, and a variance from the rear yard requirements listed under §404, to allow the construction of an apartment building in the DD/R-5-E District at premises 819 6th Street, N.W. (Square 485, Lot 15)

ACTION

DDOT has reviewed the *Applicant's* request and determined, based on the information provided, the proposal will have no adverse impacts on the travel conditions of the District's transportation network. Thus, DDOT has no objection to approval of the requested variances.

The project has the potential to generate minor impacts to on-street parking conditions in the area. Vehicle parking demand may increase slightly as a result of the project, inducing a higher level of parking utilization in the immediate area. Despite this minor potential impact, DDOT has no objection to the approval of the requested variances.

This review pertains only to zoning issues and does not consider potential impacts to District owned public space. DDOT's lack of objection to the zoning variances should not be viewed as approval of public space elements. If any portion of the project has elements in the public space, the *Applicant* may be required to pursue a public space permit through DDOT's permitting process. Guidance on the treatment of public space can be found in DDOT's Public Realm Manual.
