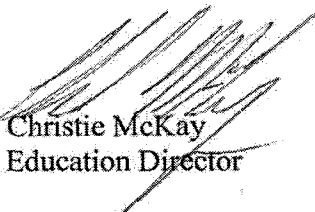
Mary's Center for Maternal and Child Care is pleased to provide this letter in support of The Family Place's renewal for a zoning variance.
