Recently, the United States Secret Service was requested through the National Capital Region Planning Commission to conduct an evaluation of a proposed renovation project for the Motion Picture Association of America building located

at 1600 I Street, NW. Specifically, NCPC (on behalf of the DC Office of Planning) asked that we determine whether the Secret Service would be opposed to a variance which would permit a "communal rooftop reception area within a portion of the existing mechanical penthouse that is accessory to an outdoor terrace." Further, NCPC requested that the Secret Service provide a response in writing/email in advance of a District of Columbia Board of Zoning Adjustment meeting occurring on Tuesday, November 24th.

At the present time, the Secret Service has no objections to the proposed variance, given the documentation that has been currently provided concerning the project. However, the Secret Service requests to be notified if any substantial revisions to the project are proposed from this point forward, and reserves the right to withdraw its concurrence based upon revised security assessments due to any proposed revisions to the project.

Please let me know if there are any concerns, or if we can be of further assistance in any way regarding this matter.

As always, we appreciate the efforts of NCPC, the DC Office of Planning, and our other partners to include security considerations as part of the planning process for the District of Columbia.
