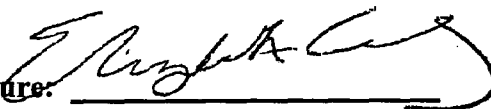

STANDARD CONDITIONS:

1. The standards of care described in the Child Development Facility Regulations (Title 29 DCMR Chapter 3) shall be provided at all times in order to protect the health, welfare, and safety of children.
2. The State Superintendent of Education or his/her designee and other District of Columbia government agencies having jurisdiction over, or responsibilities pertaining to, Child Development Facilities shall have the right, with or without prior notice, to inspect the above-named facility and the records kept.
3. This license and the Certificate of Occupancy or Home Occupation Permit for the premises, or equivalent proof that the premises complies with all applicable Federal and District of Columbia fire, safety, building, and zoning regulations and codes shall be posted in a central location on the licensed premises.
