I live at 2738 Ordway Street, NW, in Ward 3. I am writing this letter to support the proposed short term family housing at 3320 Idaho Ave., NW. Without this housing in Ward 3, the District will not be able to meet its goal of 240 replacement units for families now housed at DC General.

For many reasons, including the price of housing in the DC area, homelessness is a serious problem in Washington. I support the District's effort to build short term housing for homeless families and to place this housing in all wards. Everyone must do a share here to improve the situation. The Ward 3 shelter is designed to accommodate 50 units in a 6-story building. Although that height may not be ideal, I do not believe the design is incompatible with the neighborhood, nor will its operation adversely affect the surrounding community, which is already fairly densely settled.
