The advocacy organizations, service providers, faith organizations and community members of the Fair Budget Coalition work to meet the needs of the District's lowest-income residents. One of the most pressing concerns of the past few years is closing DC General. The size and condition of the facility make it almost impossible to adequately address the challenges faced by the families forced to live there. As an organization, we affirm the goals of the strategic plan, *Homeward DC*, that planned closing DC General and creating smaller, dignified housing in all 8 wards.

We support the short term family housing at 850 Delaware Ave. SW. The architectural plans for the facility which include a health facility on the lower levels will meet the needs of families in transition to permanent housing as well as providing sufficient capacity to make closing DC General closer to reality. The floor plans with the capacity to include families with special needs is the right size for monitoring, privacy and support. Community rooms include space needed for onsite services.

Homelessness among DC families has been, and is, a serious problem. On January 1, 2017 836 families with 1749 children were in shelter and transitional housing – too many families with young children living too long in conditions that don't support family stability or do anything to avoid development delays and long-term stress in children. We hope that the Board of Zoning Adjustment will approve the variances and exception needed to build this facility so that the District can move forward in a constructive and fair manner to address this great need.
