After touring the proposed site and looking at the proposed construction plans online, I thought overall a good utilization of existing public resources. Yes, it is a squeeze but I strongly support public property like the former police building being used for public services.

One of my major concerns is that without the proposed shelter, the District will not be able to meet its goal of closing D.C. General. The lack of adequate housing and services for our homeless population is a crisis and it's important that the city take action to create more.

My family believes that we all have a responsibility to ensure that all kids and all families in our city have equal opportunity and that their rights, including to housing and education, are respected equally. Construction of this shelter is not enough but it is an important step in that direction.
