Thank you for your letter of March 8, 2016 (Enclosure 1). As residents of Washington, DC, a bustling city, we all live and work in close proximity to services, attractions, and industries. As you know, in Ward 5—where increasingly Washingtonians seek to live, work, and play—that diverse landscape is on full display. We were able to experience that together during our neighborhood walk on Tuesday, March 8, and we look forward to returning to Ward 5 for our second walk later this month.

As noted in my letter to you of March 17, we have submitted our proposal to DC Council for their consideration. Many of you testified to the Council expressing your concerns on the proposed site, which includes the development of a short-term family housing facility at 2266 25th Place NE.
