our ANC commissioner invites "community outreach" personnel, one of which has been a business owner who has questionable business practices within the district according to several articles in the Washington Post and the Washington City Paper. Additionally, despite promises from both the owner's community outreach personnel and our ANC commissioner the residents immediately surrounding the property never received a traffic study to identify patterns in the flow of traffic through our community and potential impacts on parking. We ask that no variances related to parking requirements are approved due to the absence of a viable transportation action plan. Additionally, due to the questionable nature of the community outreach staff, this study should be conducted by a third party that has no associations with any of the parties involved.
