Dear Commissioners:

As a resident of Foggy Bottom, I am pleading for help. The neighborhood is being over-run by students from George Washington University that are continuously disturbing the peace with loud raucous parties that go well into 4:00am. and beyond. After parties consist of student party-goers drunkenly walking the neighborhood, yelling & partying, screaming obscenities at one another either jokingly, or in an argument - either way the result is a blatant disturbance of peace that no amount of police calls seem to abate. Public obscenities as well as indecent exposure is becoming more frequent. For example, male students have been caught urinating in public on the sidewalk, on hedges in the Free boxes & just laugh w/ their fellow students when confronted & ask to refrain from urinating in someone's front yard or tree

The neighborhood, in general, is rapidly degenerating as absentee landlords rent to 1 or 2 students in apart. that then increase the students, when the landlord is gone, as is, after the rental lease is signed. Some houses are being used as "fraternal-like" bases where students visit the apartments all day on a rotating basis - they leave doors unlocked so students can "come-in & hang-out" during the day. In the day & throughout the evening cars are double-parked along 24th & 25th Streets not allowing regular parker access & exit to legal parking spaces. My back yard has seen numerous cars parked illegally to attend parties. Discarded computer, abandoned couches, & garbage attract rats & other rodents which are a very ^{real} health threat. Complaints have been registered w/ students & even the absentee landlords, but the problems are getting worse & worse.

A couple of weekends ago, the hats
on 25th Street had to have

intervened several times as the partygoers
 became obstinate & refused to shut down
 the party. Hundreds of students were
 at that party, it was held in a
 small rowhouse & was teeming w/
 students who ^{many} were clearly embriated
 & aggressive. They complained when
 asked to either quiet down or close down
 the party by the police, that 'they had
 the right to party as long as they wanted
~~to~~ ^{then} threatened to call their lawyers."
 The disrespect and entitlement from these
 party revelers all students from GW showed
 no bounds in their drunken protest w/ the
 police even when told by the police that
 numerous calls from neighbors had been
 made complaining of disturbance of the peace.
 The partiers protested w/ "their right to
 party" regardless of the neighbor complaints.
 If I hadn't seen myself, I would not
 have believed. The complete & utter disregard
 & respect for one's fellow neighbors & the
 community.

Neighbors in Foggy Bottom are fed-up w/ the wanton disregard for their neighborhood. George Washington University should take responsibility for the problems students enrolled in institution are causing. Degrading, devaluing, creating health & safety concerns w/ overcrowding + fire hazards (from this overcrowd + disregard w/ littering + illegal dumping) are all too common problems for this small, historic community to deal with.
