WELCOME. THANK YOU ALL FOR COMING TONIGHT.

THIS CURRENT VOLUNTARY AND INFORMAL PROCESS IS BEING CO-SPONSORED BY ANC2A, THE DISTRICT'S OFFICE OF PLANNING, AND THE GEORGE WASHINGTON UNIVERSITY. IT IS INTENDED TO CAPTURE COMMUNITY AND OP INPUTS AND PERSPECTIVES AS GW PREPARES ITS *CONCEPTUAL FRAMEWORK* FOR MOVING FORWARD WITH THE FUTURE OF THE FOGGY BOTTOM CAMPUS INCLUDING SQUARE 54.

OVER THE SUMMER, AN INTERACTIVE DESIGN PROCESS WAS FOLLOWED AS GW'S TEAM MOVED FROM DESIGN ISSUES TO DESIGN PRINCIPLES TO CONCEPT DESIGN TO TONIGHT'S *CONCEPTUAL FRAMEWORK*. EACH STEP INCLUDED MULTIPLE OPPORTUNITIES FOR COMMUNITY INTERACTION.

IN ADDITION TO DESIGN ISSUES, THE PROCESS HAS DOCUMENTED, IN WHAT WE CALL THE *ISSUE EXHIBIT*, EVERY INFORMATION OR POLICY ISSUE THAT ANY PARTICIPANT FELT WAS RELEVANT TO THE PROJECT. COPIES OF THAT *ISSUE EXHIBIT* ARE AVAILABLE FOR ANYONE INTERESTED.

I SHOULD ALSO POINT OUT THAT THE *ISSUES EXHIBIT* AS WELL AS ALL PRESENTATIONS FROM THE SUMMER MEETINGS AND OTHER IMPORTANT

INFORMATION RELATING TO THIS PROCESS AND PROJECT ARE AVAILABLE AT A DEDICATED WEBSITE: WWW.NEIGHBORHOOD.GWU.EDU.

TONIGHT, GW WILL PRESENT ITS CONCEPTUAL FRAMEWORKS FOR THE COMMERCIAL DEVELOPMENT OF SQUARE 54 AND ITS CONCEPTUAL FRAMEWORK FOR THE FUTURE DEVELOPMENT OF THE FOGGY BOTTOM CAMPUS. YOU WILL HAVE AN OPPORTUNITY TO ASK QUESTIONS AND EXPRESS YOUR OPINION ON THEIR EFFORT. YOUR COMMENTS WILL BE DOCUMENTED AND BECOME PART OF THE RECORD.

THE FRAMEWORKS YOU SEE TONIGHT ARE NOT FINAL PRODUCTS; THEY ARE THE CURRENT STEP IN A CONTINUING PROCESS.

FOR EXAMPLE, THE FOGGY BOTTOM FRAMEWORK WILL SHOW SPECIFIC POTENTIAL DEVELOPMENT SITES AND ASSOCIATE BUILDING SIZE AND USES, AS WELL AS OPEN SPACES, POTENTIAL GARAGE LOCATIONS, ETC. HOWEVER, IT IS NOT YET AT THE LEVEL OF DETAIL THAT WILL BE REQUIRED BEFORE ANYTHING CAN BE SUBMITTED TO THE DISTRICT GOVERNMENT FOR REVIEW AND ACTION. THAT IS IN THE FUTURE AND THERE WILL BE FUTURE OPPORTUNITIES FOR COMMUNITY INPUT, INTERACTION, AND INVOLVEMENT. IN OTHER WORDS, THIS IS NOT THE LAST TIME YOU GET TO SEE, COMMENT AND PARTICIPATE IN THIS PROJECT.

GW WILL NEED TO TAKE THESE FRAMEWORKS AND PREPARE SUBMISSIONS TO THE DISTRICT GOVERNMENT. FOR SQUARE 54 THAT IS LIKELY TO BE PUD PROPOSAL, FOR FOGGY BOTTOM, IT'S A CAMPUS PLAN AMENDMENT. THE TWO ARE LINKED, BUT SEPARATE ACTIONS. THOSE SUBMISSIONS WILL TRIGGER THE DISTRICT'S REGULATORY PROCESS.

THAT INCLUDES ZONING COMMISSION HEARINGS, OFFICE OF PLANNING REPORTS, AND FORMAL REVIEW, ZC DETERMINING PARTY STATUS, ETC. THAT REGULATORY PROCESS WILL PROVIDE ADDITIONAL OPPORTUNITIES FOR INPUT AND PARTICIPATION.

THE CURRENT VOLUNTARY PROCESS THE THREE COSPONSORS AGREED TO ENDS TONIGHT. IT HAS MET ITS GOAL, WHICH WAS TO PROVIDE AN OPPORTUNITY FOR COMMUNITY AND OP INPUT AS GW PREPARED THEIR FRAMEWORKS. IN ADDITION, THROUGH THE *ISSUES EXHIBIT*, ANY ISSUE RAISED BY ANY PARTICIPANT HAS BEEN RECORDED AND WILL STAY WITH THIS PROJECT AS IT PROCEEDS.

THE COSPONSORS OF THE CURRENT PROCESS MAY CONSIDER OTHER NEXT STEPS, BUT THE ONLY DEFINITE FUTURE STEP I CAN REPORT ON TONIGHT IS THAT THIS PROJECT, LIKE ALL SIMILAR PROJECTS IN THE DISTRICT, WILL GO THROUGH THE STANDARD REGULATORY PROCESS.

TONIGHT'S AGENDA IS PRETTY STRAIGHT FORWARD. AFTER STATEMENTS FROM THE COSPONSORS, THE ARCHITECTS WILL PRESENT A BRIEF OVERVIEW FOR EACH FRAMEWORK. THE BULK OF OUR TIME TONIGHT WILL BE FOCUSED ON GETTING YOU DIRECTLY IN FRONT OF THE FRAMEWORKS AND THE ARCHITECTS TO DISCUSS THEIR WORK AND GET YOUR REACITONS.

WE'VE SET UP THREE STATIONS. ONE FOR SQUARE 54, ONE FOR THE FOGGY BOTTOM CAMPUS, AND ONE FOR THE ISSUES EXHIBIT. PLEASE FEEL FREE TO SPEND TIME AT ANY AND ALL OF THE STATIONS. LISTEN TO THE FOLKS WHO PREPARED THESE FRAMEWORKS, ASK YOUR QUESTIONS, AND PROVIDE YOUR COMMENTS, WHICH WILL BE RECORDED.

LET'S GET STARTED.




Plan for Future Campus Development

- **Integrated strategy** for Foggy Bottom campus & Square 54 to achieve **shared benefits** for Community, District and the University
- **Campus Plan Amendment** to accommodate forecasted University needs of **2 million square feet** on campus
 - Student Housing: **~500,000 square feet (1,000 beds)** to meet student demand
 - Academic: **~1.5 million square feet** (including Science Center, School of Public Health, Cancer Center)
 - Increase overall campus FAR **from 3.5 to 4.5**
 - Targeted density along **23rd Street & Pennsylvania Avenue**
- Future development in accordance with the **design principles & concepts** conceived through this process
- **Square 54** developed as a commercial mixed-use **Town Center** (separate PUD)



Neighborhood-GW Advisory Committee

- GW seeks to establish regular **quarterly community meetings** as mandated under the Campus Plan Order
 - to “*foster consistent communication between the University and the Foggy Bottom/West End community, discussing issues of mutual interest and proposing solutions to problems that exist or arise in implementing the approved Campus Plan*”




GOAL: Establish procedures to **constructively identify, address and resolve** ongoing operational issues and mutual concerns

- e.g., student behavior concerns, loading dock issues, etc.



Compliance, Monitoring & Enforcement

- GW will continue to **comply with the conditions** of the Campus Plan Order
 - including the **student housing requirement** that goes into effect in Fall 2006
- GW will work with the community and District agencies to develop **mechanisms to demonstrate our compliance** with existing and future commitments



GOAL: Establish reasonable and predictable method for **monitoring compliance** and procedures to ensure **enforcement**



GW Commitments

- Continued compliance with **Campus Plan**
- If proposed development plan approved, **accommodate forecasted academic and housing space needs on campus** and develop **Square 54** as a commercial mixed-use “**town center**”
- Decision on future uses of **HOVA** and **The Aston** other than undergraduate student housing
- Establish effective **compliance, monitoring and enforcement mechanisms**



Existing & Proposed University Activities









Proposed Land Uses







Proposed Lot Coverage





Existing and Proposed Open Spaces







Proposed Pathways/ Linkages







MEETING MINUTES

Community facilitator David Julyan opened the meeting with an introductory statement that outlined the parties co-sponsoring the summer series of meetings (ANC2A, the DC Office of Planning, and GW) and the community based planning process.

Following Mr. Julyan's introduction, each of the cosponsors made brief statements:

- Lou Katz, GW Executive Vice President & Treasurer, reviewed the University's plan for future campus development, the need for a Neighborhood-GW Advisory Committee, GW's compliance, monitoring and enforcement of the current campus plan, and GW's specific commitments with respect to campus development issues.
- Vince Micone, Chair ANC2A, spoke of the community's willingness to engage in an open and transparent process, but reminded all participants that there were many steps left to take and no agreement on either 1) what the final plans should include or 2) any process other than the District's normal procedures.
- Travis Parker, DC Office of Planning, spoke regarding OP's commitment to a transparent and inclusive process and to the regulatory process that would follow the current, voluntary effort. Ellen McCarthy, Director of the Office of Planning joined the meeting and participated in the stations [described below].

Matt Bell of EEK Architects, presented an overview of the framework for the Foggy Bottom campus and neighborhoods. Rafael Pelli of Cesar Pelli & Associates presented an overview of the framework for Square 54.

Following the presentations by Mr. Bell and Mr. Pelli, meeting participants were given the opportunity to visit three "stations" set up in different areas of the room: one station addressed the Square 54 framework, one station addressed the Foggy Bottom campus framework, and the final station addressed the *Issues Exhibit*. The stations provided meeting participants the opportunity to see the framework plans up-close, discuss them with the architects, and provide direct feedback and input. [See attached *COMMUNITY COMMENTS*]

After approximately one hour, Mr. Julyan reconvened the full meeting. He reviewed next steps, explaining that the University would be refining the framework plans in preparation for pursuing government approvals. He informed meeting participants that they would continue to have the opportunity to provide their input. The *Issues Exhibit* would remain open for four weeks, giving community members additional time to review the document and raise issues not yet addressed. Updates will be provided to those who had shared their contact details and all community members can stay informed by regularly checking the community based planning process website at www.neighborhood.gwu.edu.

COMMUNITY COMMENTS (*recorded on flipcharts during meeting*)

FOGGY BOTTOM CAMPUS: PROPOSED CONCEPT PLAN

- retain the park at the cancer center site (39A)
- height at the cancer center near residential side should be appropriate
- at the southern side of the cancer center sculpt the building so that there is a line of site to Washington Circle from the current apartment building behind it.
- the proposed heights at Square 54 and the cancer center [130'] are too high
- look at adding space on top of Ross Hall
- the oxygen supply at the hospital is an eyesore
- plans should be representative of the actual building
- increase residential permit parking (parking near commercial sites)
- the proposed height for Square 54 [130'] is out of context with the neighborhood
- general concern in the District overall about GW "gobbling-up" real estate and using it for commercial purposes
- will the university maintain ownership of the old hospital site?
- spreading out parking is preferable for environmental reasons
- what are the numbers like for the plan to demolish the University Parking Garage and building new underground parking?
- what is the phasing of the projects (specifically: the science center and Square 54)?
- what will happen to restaurants in the new building development on 2100 Pennsylvania?
- What will happen to the fraternities on G between 20th and 21st Streets?
- is there an opportunity to involve students in the new development (parking, engineering)?
- how about an ID system for student cars?
- does the university own all of the proposed development area at 22nd and G Streets?
- there is no reason why non-profits should not "have a little oil well" to make some money
- the FAR and underground development should be maximized
- what proposed development sites have been scratched and why?
- to what extent will this model change?
- no late-night activities at 24th and H street development
- really concentrate the development with very large buildings in the middle of campus
- housing at Square 54 will be another Columbia Plaza; student housing will face market housing; instead, place the residential uses on 54 and anywhere where prospective apartments do not face dorms.
- when adding retail on I Street please be careful not to have any uses that are too loud late at night

- what types of tenants are attracted to this property?
- what type of traffic (foot or car) will come from the grocery store?
- grocery carts travel – what types of barriers to prevent this?
- what are the retail spaces sized to house?

- where will the entrance to the grocery store be?

- suppose you cut the building to 90 feet, is it still lucrative?
- of the 30 feet of sidewalk how much is private and how much is public space?
- concern that there is landscaping planned on public not private space
- what impact would loading/parking have on existing parking spaces on 22nd Street?
- is the interior space open to the public?
- where does the building property line end on I street?
- are Pennsylvania Avenue and 22nd Street exclusively office space?
- what types of retail are being considered?
- will the buildings be connected by a skywalk on the upper floors?
- which of the buildings will have green space on the roof? For what use?
- what characteristics will the buildings have?
- where are we with affordable housing? will there be any? what price? how many?
- will you landscape the 30 foot sidewalk?
- concerned that the facade will be one big block
- would like the design to indicate that there is a historic neighborhood close by
- will there be more meetings once there is a hearing on the actual design?
- where is the underground entrance planned for the grocery store?
- will there be any bridges between buildings?
- why is there an opening into the interior from the street?
- what type of office tenants are being considered?
- will there be any type of connection between tenant and the university (i.e. medical offices)?
- how long is Boston Properties involved in the project?

The meeting convened at 6:40 pm.

David Julyan opened the meeting with an introductory statement that outlined the parties co-sponsoring the process (ANC2A, DC Office of Planning, and GW University) and the process that had been followed over the summer. The full statement is posted on the dedicated website: (www.neighborhood.gwu.edu).

The purpose of this meeting was the presentation of GW's conceptual framework for the development of Square 54 and their conceptual framework for the future development of the Foggy Bottom campus, and capturing initial reactions and comments from the participants. In addition, the *Issues Exhibit* was explained. The *Issues Exhibit*, which records any issue that any participant felt was relevant to the project will remain open for four (4) weeks for additional issues from participants and comments from the cosponsors.

It was highlighted that this was the last meeting of the current process. The GW development teams had spent the summer listening and interacting with the community and would now present GW's frameworks. The frameworks are not final products and are not ready for submission to the District government; they are the current step in a continuing process.

Next steps in the process would include preparing these frameworks and submitting them to the District's regulatory process. The cosponsors may consider other steps, but only submitting to the regulatory process was known for sure.

The agenda for the meeting was reviewed. The agenda is posted at the website. After brief statements from the cosponsors, and general overviews of the two frameworks, the focus for the meeting was to provide residents with a direct presentation of the frameworks and to capture comments and reactions. Three "stations" were established in different areas of the room. One station addressed the Square 54 framework, one station addressed the Foggy Bottom campus framework, and the final station addressed the *Issues Exhibit*.

Each cosponsor made brief statements. Lou Katz, GW's Executive Vice President, reviewed their plan for future campus development, the need for a Neighborhood-GW Advisory Committee, GW's compliance, monitoring and enforcement of the current campus plan, and GW's commitments. Mr. Katz's presentation is posted on the website.

After those presentations, participants moved to the "stations" for approximately 1 hour. Comments, questions, and reactions from participants at the framework stations were recorded and are presented as an addendum to this Report.
