Dear Chairwoman and members of the Zoning Commission,

My name is Lamar A. Thorpe, Student Association President at The George Washington University, which represents all students. The last time I was here, I testified about student involvement in developing and assembling the over-whelming support for the 20-year campus plan.

Today, I am here supporting the Square 54 proposal. You know, I can not help but tell you that with 5-years of active duty service, I thought being Student Body President would be a walk in the part—surprise to me—not at the most politically active University in the world.

If there are two important lessons that I have learned they are one, that ideas can not and should not be implemented without giving everyone involved a place at the bargaining table—in other words being thoughtful and two, one simply can not please everyone.
