Student Housing Wait List Management

Georgetown University carefully manages its housing supply to meet demand for University housing. As a result of these efforts, since 2004 (after the completion and occupancy of the Southwest Quadrangle) all students requesting University housing—including all students on the wait list—have been provided with housing.

Student housing selection occurs at different times of year depending on class level, as detailed in the timeline below:

- During the fall semester, upper class students (rising juniors and seniors) apply for and select housing for the following academic year.
- During the spring semester, rising sophomore students select housing for the following academic year.
- During the summer months, incoming freshmen and first-year transfer students under 21, who are required to live in University housing, are placed in housing for the following academic year.

In addition, since 2004, all wait-listed students have been offered University housing before the end of the spring semester. For example, for the upcoming Fall 2011 semester, all students who were on the wait list were offered a space before Easter break. Since 2004, the University has accommodated all last-minute requests by students for University housing because of a change in plans before the start of classes started in the fall.
