PROPOSED MAIN CAMPUS STUDENT HEADCOUNT

Under the 2010 Campus Plan, Georgetown University will, for the first time, agree to a voluntary maximum on overall Main Campus student enrollment (covering graduate and undergraduate students), to be coupled with an agreement to freeze undergraduate enrollment at currently-permitted levels, as described in Exhibit L. As illustrated below, the voluntary Main Campus maximum will be based on the number of students enrolled in a program based at the Main Campus, and will be calculated each semester.

I. Headcount

The current Main Campus student headcount is 14,033 students, derived as set forth below.

The proposed voluntary maximum Main Campus student headcount is 16,133 students based on the same methodology set forth below.

In light of the University's agreement to freeze traditional full-time undergraduate enrollment at currently-permitted levels discussed in Exhibit L, the proposed growth in overall Main Campus student headcount will be largely in graduate student programs.

II. Methodology

The proposed methodology for determining the "Main Campus Student Headcount" starts with the total number of students reported under the Integrated Postsecondary Education Database System (IPEDS), which was established by the National Center for Education Statistics, a division of the U.S. Department of Education.¹ All postsecondary institutions that participate in federal student financial aid programs, like Georgetown, must report to IPEDS using standardized data definitions and parameters.

To determine "Main Campus Student Headcount," the total graduate and undergraduate student enrollment number reported under IPEDS is reduced by students enrolled in a program that is based at a location other than the Main Campus.

"Main Campus Student Headcount" for fall 2010 is as follows:

For purposes of Georgetown's voluntary maximum on overall Main Campus student enrollment during the years covered by the 2010 Campus Plan, the same methodology would be used for calculating Main Campus Student Headcount.

This proposed methodology is predicated on federally-defined and federally-required reported enrollment statistics, and appropriately subtracts students not located on Main Campus. The Zoning Commission has recently affirmed the exclusion of students that do not have a "primary relationship" with the campus for purposes of calculating an enrollment maximum related to that campus, since such students have limited contact with the campus and are therefore unlikely to impose objectionable impacts due to noise, traffic, number of students, or other objectionable conditions. See Z.C. Order No. 06-11B/06-12B at 9 (2010).

III. Historical Information

For comparative purposes, the following chart illustrates the Main Campus Student Headcount for the past five years under the 2000 Campus Plan.
