

Density (students per acre) of GU compared to U.S. News 50 Universities

The information on the next two pages compares the density of Georgetown University's main campus – the number of enrolled students per acre of campus – with the density of the other 50 universities listed by U.S. News & World Report. The ANC 2E presentation (Slide # 37) summarizes this information.

The information shows that Georgetown University has enrolled more students per acre than any of the other universities in the list except for New York University and Columbia University¹, which are both located in extremely high density, high-rise-building areas. GU's extremely high enrollment density significantly increases its impact on the surrounding neighborhoods.

¹ In the summary shown in Slide # 37, Columbia is not included in the under-200 group since it is not a coherent campus. Also, like NYU, Columbia's core area is in extremely dense Manhattan
