The collapsed slope in April 2010. Georgetown University has built a retaining wall below the road.

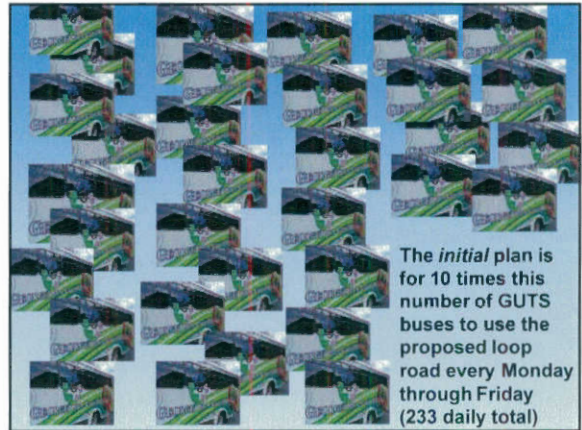
Looking up at the university campus from Glover Archbold Park
