LOCAL NEIGHBORHOOD OUTREACH AND COMMUNITY MEETINGS
SUMMARY

For nearly 20 years, Georgetown University has reached out to the communities immediately surrounding the University in a variety of ways. From a weekly calendar of events, posted on neighborhood listserves (inviting neighbors to attend campus lectures, performing art, athletic and other events), to sponsorship of community-wide activities and donations to support community organizations and activities, to participation on the boards of local business associations, the University has endeavored to be a good and fully participating neighbor. In addition, Georgetown has actively engaged with the local community by hosting regularly-scheduled community meetings to discuss issues of importance to the University and neighbors.

In the 1990 Campus Plan, the Board of Zoning Adjustment (BZA) required the University to hold quarterly update meetings. These became known as BZA Quarterly meetings, involving four surrounding Advisory Neighborhood Commissions (2E, 3B, 3C and 3D) and seven communities (Burleith, Georgetown, Foxhall, Hillandale, Cloisters, Palisades and Glover Park.) While the BZA did not mandate the continuation of these meetings in the approved 2000 Campus Plan, the University has – on its own initiative – continued to organize and facilitate the meetings on an ongoing, regular basis throughout the ten year period of the 2000-2010 Campus Plan.

Additionally, as a result of the 2000 Campus Plan, beginning in 2005, the University established and convened, on nearly a monthly basis, meetings of the Alliance for Local Living (ALL) intended to provide a mechanism for enhanced communication and feedback regarding off campus issues. ALL comprises all community stakeholders: students living off campus, residents, University staff, MPD representatives, landlords and, from time to time, city agency representatives.

2010-2020 Campus Plan Meetings

Starting in Fall 2008, Georgetown actively engaged with neighborhood groups and individuals on the development of the 2010 Plan. The Campus Plan website (<http://www.georgetown.edu/about/campus-plan/index.html>) was created as a means of sharing information/documents directly with the community as well as receiving input/feedback as the Plan was being developed. Campus Plan Community meetings were held on the dates and covered the topics listed below:

Saturday, November 8, 2008: A meeting to present the process and gather initial input and priorities from the community.

Saturday, May 30, 2009: An overview and discussion meeting with community members regarding plan options, as presented to the University by their architects.

Wednesday, November 4, 2009: Off-Campus Life, Housing, and Enrollment specific topic discussion.

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Thursday, November 12, 2009: Transportation specific topic discussion.

Monday, November 16, 2009: 1789 Block specific topic discussion.

Wednesday, November 18, 2009: Draft Campus Plan meeting with discussion of guiding principles, Plan overview, the student experience, sustainability, enrollment, housing, transportation, internal infrastructure, and MedStar Hospital.

Thursday, November 19, 2009: Draft Campus Plan meeting with discussion of guiding principles, Plan overview, the student experience, sustainability, enrollment, housing, transportation, internal infrastructure, and MedStar Hospital.

Monday, April 26, 2010: Discussion of proposed final plan with a presentation of changes that had been made since the initial November 2008 meeting. A plan summary document was posted online prior to the meeting and more details on certain topics were discussed at the meeting.

Friday, May 7, 2010: On campus tour with University administrators for neighbors to view and discuss the Campus Service Road, Heating and Cooling Plant and Chimney, Kehoe Field, North Kehoe Field, and other portions of the campus.

Friday, May 14, 2010: On campus tour with University administrators for neighbors to view and discuss the Campus Service Road, Heating and Cooling Plant and Chimney, Kehoe Field, North Kehoe Field, and other portions of the campus.

Tuesday, August 31, 2010: Meeting between community leadership and University leadership in an effort to come to agreement on community areas of concern. Facilitated by Don Edwards of Justice & Sustainability.
