Dear Zoning Commissioners:

I am writing to oppose in the strongest way possible approval of Georgetown University's request for a continuance of the hearing scheduled for Monday, June 20, 2011.

After the insulting transportation plan submitted earlier by GU, it is unconscionable to allow them further leeway to subvert the process to their benefit. We all knew the process and followed your rules to make our objections known. GU has known for 10 years what they had to do and suddenly they do not have enough time to complete what should have been submitted several months ago. They have the resources and personnel to accomplish whatever they want. They apparently chose not to or thought they could convince the Zoning Board to give them as much leeway as they wanted.

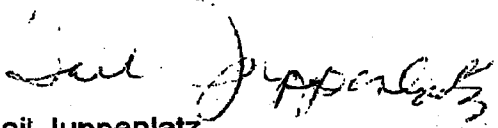
This is not fair and should reinforce to the Board the ongoing attitude of GU towards their neighbors and their contempt for the system. The Chairman of the Zoning Board, gave them significant leeway during the entire course of the hearings. It is now enough.

GU's vagueness about the proposed Hospital in their plans and thereby ignoring the transportation aspect of the campus plan and their unwillingness to commit to anything appears to me to be part of another plan to take advantage of all of us again. They have already had an additional opportunity to submit a responsible transportation plan and should be held to their choice not to comply.

Their proven ability to take advantage of everything left undocumented is a fact. The Board should make them accept the consequences of submitting an inadequate or incomplete transportation proposal. A continuance will just allow them to continue with their insensitive activities and undoubtedly find some other avenue to subvert or modify any restrictions. I truly believe that suddenly in the next year a huge hospital will need to be built immediately and anything not finalized in this plan will be open to them to do whatever they want at our expense

We continue to ask that the Board require GU to house their undergraduates on campus, reduce their graduate population and find a satellite location for their huge graduate program.
