Re: Georgetown University Campus Plan

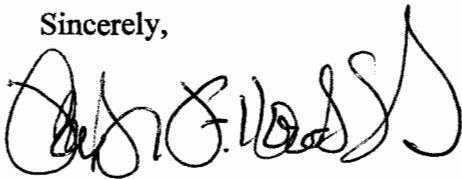
Mr. Hood and Members of the Zoning Commission,

I have been a resident of Georgetown for nearly three years. I write to voice my strong support of the proposed 2010-2020 Campus Plan for Georgetown University. The University has been serving the Washington DC community, indeed the entire country, for more than 200 years. Over this time, Georgetown University has educated thousands of DC residents so that they could give back to our community something of what was first given to them. Approval of this campus plan will allow the University to be of even greater service in the years to come.

I live less than two blocks from the main entrance to the University. The block is populated primarily by Georgetown students. They bring life and energy to my neighborhood, and I value their presence. My experience has been that, if any of them is a problem for me, I can call the University and be confident that the University will resolve the matter promptly. I personally benefit from the open spaces on the beautiful university grounds and the cultural and religious activities that the University offers to the community.

For instance, the University proposes no new construction off campus, and holds undergrad enrollment steady. Indeed, implementation of the plan will make Georgetown an even better neighbor. I hope you will consider my wishes in making your decision on the plan.
