Re: Fun Fair Video, request for continuance to prevent closure, case # 17504

Dear Chairperson Miller and Members of the Board:

On September 11, 2007, at the duly noticed, regularly scheduled monthly meeting of ANC 6C, with a quorum of five out of nine commissioners and the public in attendance, the matter of the closure of Fun Fair Video came before us. The commissioners voted unanimously, 5:0:0 to oppose the continued operation of this applicant. Previously ANC 6C sent a letter to the BZA opposing this establishment.

We have recently received word on October 11, 2007, that Fun Fair Video has submitted a consent continuance request to delay action on this closing. ANC 6C, prompted by the affected ANC 6C01 SMD commissioner, is strongly opposed to this motion by the applicant to request a continuance or a stay in consideration of this case. The motion to oppose this continuance is unanimous, 5:0:0. The reasons are that this establishment is in violation of its certificate of occupancy and, moreover, represents a continued threat to the peace, order, and quiet of the surrounding community. We have heard loud and clear from our constituents, represented by the Coalition of Citizens to Shut Down Fun Fair Video, that the neighborhood is united in supporting the closing of this business, which detracts from the quality of life of the adjacent residential community due to the nature of its sexually oriented business.

Thank you for giving great weight to the voice of ANC 6C, which represents the constituents in the vicinity of this establishment.
