I, Loniese Lee attest that for at least 2-3 days the builder had workers with equipment to tear down the house located at 1233 Morse St, NE. I noticed also the builder did not secure the construction area so the neighborhood children would not be playing around and in the area. Every evening I came home from work another part of the building was gone until Friday, February 17, 2006. On that day upon returning home from work, I saw that the house was gone but the sitting room still remained. The sitting room, however, was not stable because it was leaning toward the hole where the house formerly sat. The builder left the sitting room leaning toward the hole over the holiday weekend. The very next day which was President's Day and Monday, the sitting room fell that night leaving live wires exposed, water pipes broken and the fire department along with all utility companies were on the scene. This knocked out electricity in some of the surrounding area including my house and street lights on my block.

This event was the subject of local TV news coverage. Cameras and news reporters were interviewing local residents, one of whom was my God sister, Camilla Parker.

I did make contact with Mr. Bill Crews on several occasions regarding this property prior to the roof's construction. Please find attached emails of our correspondences.
