MCINTURFF ARCHITECTS

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McInturff Architects is a 8-person firm based in Bethesda, Maryland, dedicated to the making of highly crafted modern residential, commercial and small institutional projects. The firm, founded in 1986, is involved throughout the entire project, from programming to complete architectural and interior design. The working process requires considerable interaction with clients, allowing each project to be tailored to the specifics of each owner.

McInturff Architects has received more than 300 design awards, including a 2003 AIA Institute Honor Award for Interior Architecture for the Martin Shocket residence, a 2005 AIA Institute Honor Award for Regional and Urban Design for their part in the redevelopment of Cady's Alley, a commercial district in Georgetown, and a 2006 Institute Honor Award for Interior Architecture for the Woolly Mammoth Theatre.

The projects have been frequently published, locally, nationally, and internationally. The work of the firm is the subject of three monographs published by the Images Publishing Group of Australia — *In Detail: McInturff Architects* (2001), *In Residence: McInturff Architects* (2007), and *In House: McInturff Architects* (2013).

MARK MCINTURFF FAIA

Mark McInturff FAIA is a native of Washington DC and received his B. Architecture from the University of Maryland School of Architecture, Planning and Preservation with its first graduating class in 1972. He taught at the University of Maryland from 1980 to 2006, from 1987 as an annual visiting critic. He was appointed as the University of Maryland Kea Professor for Spring 2003. He is a visiting critic at the Catholic University of America's School of Architecture and Planning, co-teaching a studio that focuses on historic preservation and adaptive reuse. McInturff was elevated to the College of Fellows of the American Institute of Architects in 2000.
