

The Triangle Park is in Public Space


“Public space” means all the publicly owned property between the property lines on a street, as such property lines are shown on the records of the District, and includes any roadway, tree space, sidewalk, or parking between such property lines. –D.C. Official Code § 10-1101.01(6)

The area that comprises the Triangle Park was condemned in 1930 for the purpose of widening C Street, 21st Street, and Cool Spring Road, N.E. (now Oklahoma Avenue). There is no square or lot number associated with the Triangle Park and there was never a reservation number assigned to the Triangle Park.



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
