JPDS will take traffic counts at the intersections of Decatur and 16th Streets and Crittenden and 16th Streets on an annual basis and will submit the results to DDOT by November 30 of each year for two consecutive years after the proposed plans are in place. If JPDS successfully meets its projections, its obligations to continue monitoring will cease. If JPDS does not meet its projections for two years in a row, it shall work with DDOT to develop additional techniques and mechanisms to mitigate its impact and reduce parking demand and trip generation.		February 3, 2025, DDOT concurs with the Applicant that a performance monitoring plan is not needed.
