RE: ANC-7D Letter of Support for District of Columbia Primary Care Association's (DCPCA) PUD Application for a Second Stage Review and Approval of a Planned Unit Development, Zoning Map Amendment and a Corresponding Modification to an Approved First Stage Planned Unit Development (Square 5055, Lots 23, 24, 25, 801, 802 and Portions of Lots 22 and 803) Zoning Case No. 0528B

This letter is to advise the District of Columbia Zoning Commission that Advisory Neighborhood Commission (ANC) 7D held a vote on Tuesday, September 14, 2010 during its regularly scheduled and properly noticed monthly meeting to support the District of Columbia Primary Care Association's PUD Application to the D.C. Zoning Commission for the following:

- Second Stage Review and Approval of a Planned Unit Development
- Zoning Map Amendment
- Corresponding Modification to an Approved First Stage Planned Unit Development

The result of that vote, which was a quorum of members, was 3 yeas 1 nay to support the Application that was submitted by DCPCA.

ANC-7D Commission and the Parkside Community understand the gravity of providing quality health care to those who are unable to travel across the Washington Metropolitan Area; as well as, the underprivileged. We need to eliminate inequality in health care outcomes and ensure the ratio of physicians begin to service the populated 300,000 of its 572,000 residents who live in communities that the federal government categorize as "Medically Underserved" or Health Professional Shortage Areas." Because of this categorization many constituents are sicker and die younger; the emergency rooms are being utilized inappropriately; higher rates of disability

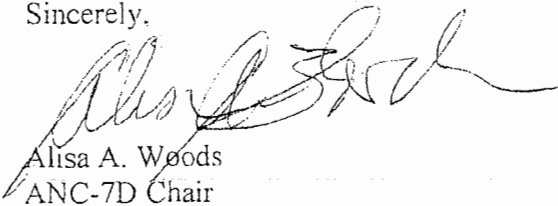
