

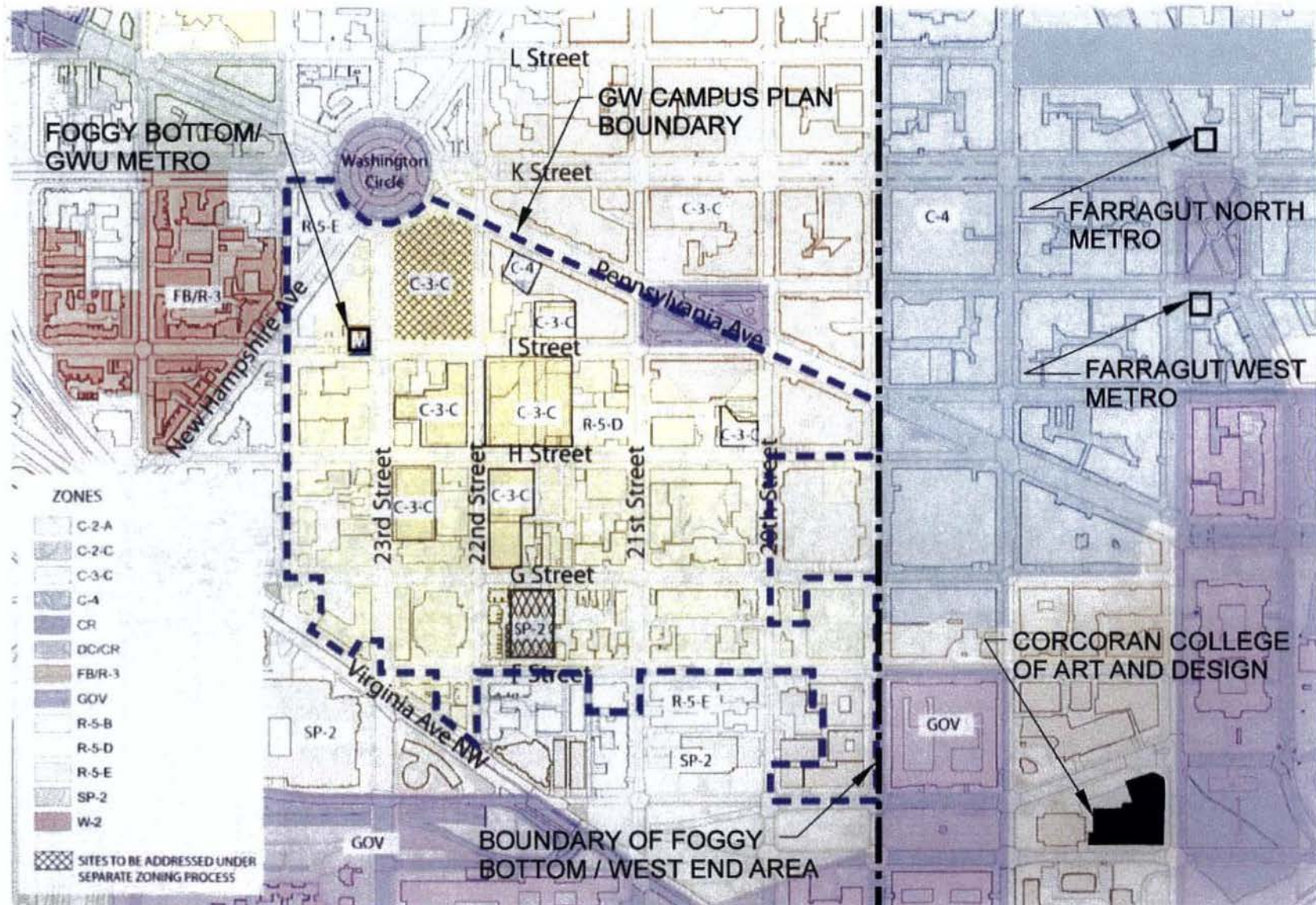

Overview of GW and The Corcoran

- In August 2014, GW, the Corcoran and the National Gallery of Art entered into a collaborative agreement
 - GW established the George Washington University Corcoran School of the Arts and Design and admitted approximately 400 existing Corcoran undergraduate and graduate students
 - GW took ownership of the Corcoran at 500 17th St NW
 - NGA took responsibility for the Corcoran's art collections
 - NGA will use space on the second floor of the 17th Street building as art exhibition space

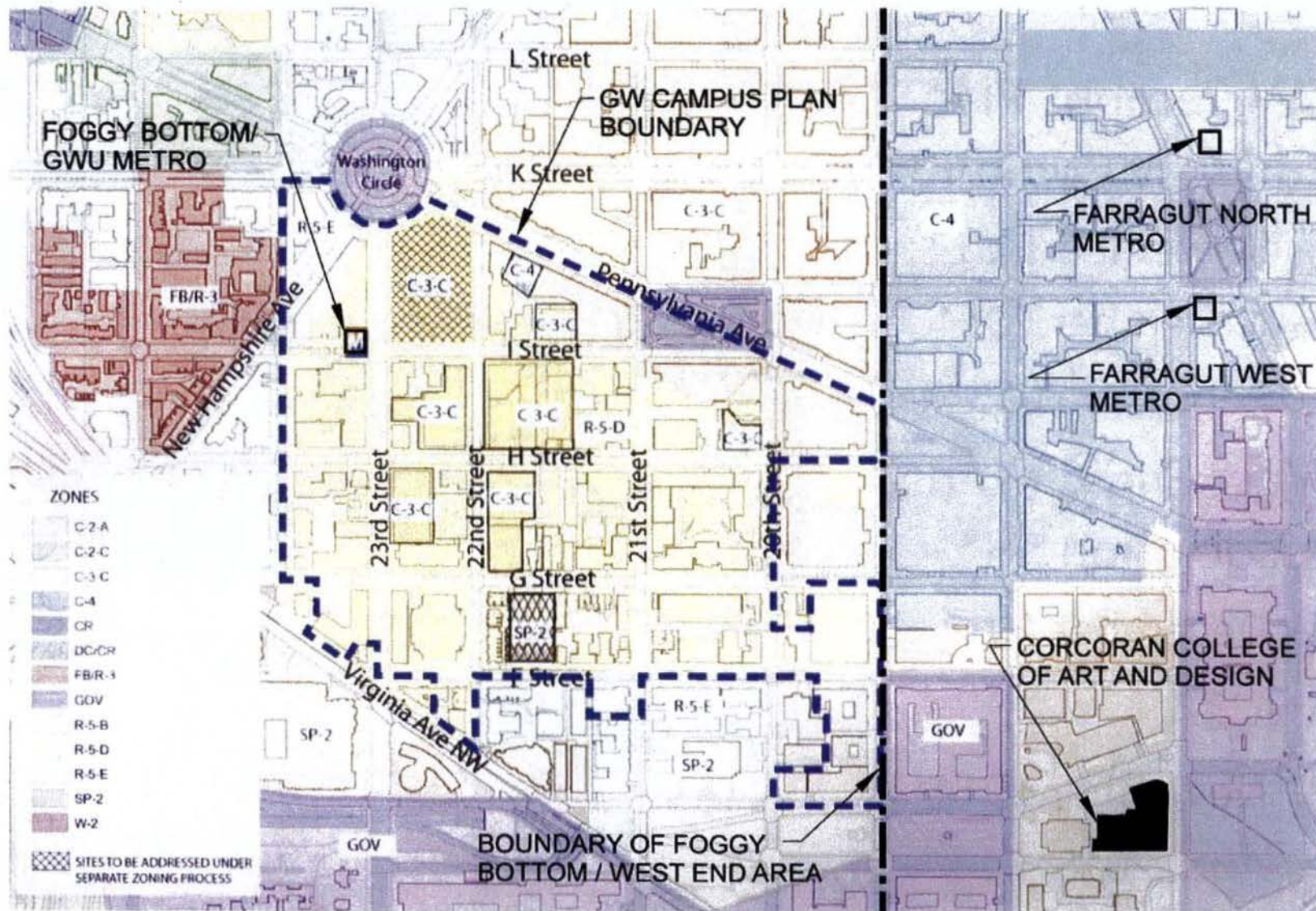

Summary of Requests
