I am writing to strongly urge the members of the Zoning Commission to act in the financial and political interest of this city by supporting the zoning relief requested by Western Development through its principal Herb Miller The current financing challenge we face as a city is that the total anticipated cost for parking is in excess of \$74,000,000 and the only available funding is limited to \$21,000,000. We have few options unless we go into partnership with a private developer

I am however unalterably opposed any plans, which would provide for the construction of two unsightly exposed parking garages in front of our stadium. Despite a disadvantageous lease agreement with Major League Baseball, our publicly financed stadium should still command the prerogatives of ownership The overall look and feel of the site is essential to current and future development and revenue for the city. Additionally, the construction of surface only parking lots would deprive the city of millions in anticipated revenue due to the absence of any residential or retail development potential Completely underground lots while an appealing option, are at this point unrealistic and excessively expensive

I am of the belief that the city should be required to develop a financing plan through the private sector, to close the gap in financing prior to the start of construction and subject to the approval of the Council There exist no other feasible options at this late hour to meet our objectives while complying with the contractual parking commitments to Major League Baseball.
