Points of Clarification and Correction on
Revisions to certain paragraphs concerning the Proposed Order

Dear Chairman Hood and Members of the Commission:

FAWS makes a point of clarification by being on record that if the Commission should adopt the DECISION # 2 (g) as FAWS submitted it yesterday (including the attendant revised FOFs), to wit:

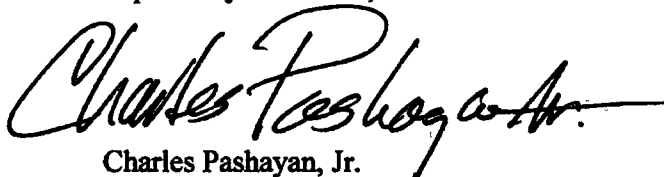
g. All aspects of the proposed A1 building (height, bulk, and maximum lot coverage) shall remain as submitted by the University, except that the location and alignment of the proposed A1 building shall be such that: (1) its length shall be perpendicular to Foxhall Road and parallel with W Street; (2) its south side shall adjoin the east-west service road now existing along north side of Eckles Library; and (3) its east side shall be no closer to Foxhall Road than is the east side of Eckles Library. The University shall submit supplemental drawings, plans, elevations, etc., consistent with this decision.

or language to the same effect, then FAWS would concur and agree that the University's 2010 Campus Plan, including the relocated A1 building, would not be likely to become objectionable to neighboring property.

Also, yesterday's letter to the Commission was inadvertently misdated as "Thursday, April 15, 2010." Instead, yesterday's letter should have been dated "Wednesday, April 21, 2010," the day it was drafted. FAWS apologizes for the error.

Again, FAWS thanks the Commission for its due consideration of FAWS's position.
