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

Economic diversity will be a thing of the past if so many of our single family row homes are chopped up into smaller homes for residents to live in for a shorter duration.

Please limit the number of dwellings in our neighborhoods with these wonderful DC attached homes; TWO family should be the limit. Please limit the height, so the historic character of our gorgeous city will be preserved for future generations.
