Community events and programming

Descriptions of the examples of events and programming hosted by the Applicant are as follows:

- DC Scoop – An annual, summertime free ice cream festival for the community to enjoy local and regional ice cream purveyors’ products, a highlight of the event is a kid’s ice cream eating competition; the event has showcased and been the launching point for small and local businesses, one example being the winner of the 2nd Annual DC Scoop. After winning the ice cream competition at DC Scoop, the owner decided to quit her full time job to pursue her passion and has recently opened her first retail location, Ice Cream Jubilee, at The Yards in Southeast DC;
- The Children’s Chess Tournament – A kids chess tournament hosted by Union Market and developed in partnership with former 5D ANC Commissioner, Vaughn Bennett, for local elementary school children through high school youth; over 60 children participated in the event for the chance to win trophies and gift cards that was held at the market; former Commissioner Bennett believes that valuable life lessons can be developed in children through teaching them to play chess; the event was very well received by the community;
- The Kids Food Festival – An event focused on attracting families with children ages 6 months to tweens who are interested in learning about better food choices in a fun and engaging environment that empowers children to make decisions for themselves to fight childhood obesity; activities included happy family balanced plate scavenger hunt, kitchen playground, chef led cooking classes, and exposed parents to products and services to benefit healthy eating for their families;
- Israel Baptist Gospel Brunches – Israel Baptist Church is a local, Ward 5 church that the Applicant partnered with by making donations to their music program and hosting their choir to perform in the Market regularly;
- Boogie Babes – A live music performance for children (mostly infants and toddlers), Boogie Babes was created by two District mothers in 2008 to provide an educational, fun, and entertaining musical experience for young children; Union Market hosts Boogie Babes, which is typically anywhere from thirty to fifty (that number looks good) kids and their parents at the Market each week on Wednesday mornings;
- The Thread pop-up retail event – A weekend pop-up retail event that gives locally and nationally recognized fashion and lifestyle brands a venue to sell to and connect with customers, along with attracting new retail from outside of the District;

- Here & Now – a fashion based retail initiative that supports emerging designers from DC with the opportunity to showcase and sell their designs to the public, in an arena that smaller brands would not have access to;
- James Beard Foundation Sunday Supper – an event benefiting the James Beard Foundation Scholarship Program and Good Food Merchants Guild, the proceeds which are used to establish a grant awarded to a woman entrepreneur who seeks a career as a restaurateur; this fundraising event highlights local and nationally recognized chefs and brings attention to the District as a significant player in the sustainable food movement (a James Beard Foundation Sunday Supper had not been held in the District prior to Union Market hosting the first one in 2012 and has become an annual event at Union Market each year since then);
- Drive in movies – A weekly event providing a retro movie-going experience with movies projected on the side of the Market building allowing attendees to watch from their cars or in the picnic area; Union Market has hosted five drive-in movie series, consisting of twenty movies that are all open to the public;
- FRESHFARM Market – Union Market partners with local non-profit FRESHFARM Markets to bring a local farmers market offering fresh, healthy food and a SNAP or food stamp program to Ward 5 each Sunday from May to October; Union Market has made financial contributions to FRESHFARM Market to subsidize the weekly event (\$5,000 for 2014);
- Yoga – Union Market hosts weekly yoga classes every Sunday that are free and open to the public, encouraging the community to stay active and healthy.
