As a Brookland resident, **I am deeply troubled by the ongoing displacement of families of color** from the city as the District becomes increasingly gentrified and affordable housing disappears. It is critical that we preserve affordable housing in the city, especially multiple bedroom units because they are becoming increasingly scarce.

As such, I am writing in support of ONE DC and the Brookland Manor/Brentwood Village Resident Association and their demands. Mid-City Financial is attempting to displace working class people of color from one of the few remaining affordable housing properties in Washington, DC.
