

THE RESIDENTS OF 6TH STREET NE

As a current resident residing on the 4800 block of 6th Street NE, I have concerns about the new development under review. As noted in the current draft for the new construction agreement there is only one means for entering and exiting the properties which is the 4700-4800 block of 6th Street NE. There are currently twenty homes along with the daily Food Bank traffic utilizing the 4700-4800 block of 6th street NE. An additional forty homes would create a major traffic issue.

It would be in the best interest all of residents to open the entrance to 6th Street (Emerson Park) to equally support the new influx of traffic. We are requesting that a traffic/ safety review be conducted prior to rendering a final decision to ensure that proposal complies with DC Readiness Evacuation Plan. As it stands there are safety issues due to the increase of traffic and the speed in which the vehicles currently travel.

As a parent, my children are not permitted to play outside because of the vehicles traveling to and from the Food Bank not adhering to the speed limit. The residents have conveyed their concerns about the traffic to several governing bodies (Angel Alston, ANC representative as well as Wesley Dawson, Constituent Services Coordinator) to no avail we continue to be overlooked. The residents requested speed bumps however, to date we haven't received any feedback in regards to the approval. We are asking that all efforts be made to assist us in resolving our concerns. As constituents and supporters of our community leaders, we need our concerns heard and addressed.

Thank you in advance for your careful review all matters and guidance in developing a plan that is in best interest all the residents of 6th Street NE.
