We, Eleanor and Clarence Moore, are part of the Concerned Citizens of North Michigan Park who oppose a bike/foot path for Comstock's development project in case #15-04. We don't have a problem with the housing.

Our house is right next door to the planned development at the dead end 4800 block of 6th Street, NE. It's very isolated at this dead end street across from the Food Bank. As senior citizens, we are home during the day. From our front window, on a regular basis we witness criminal acts like robberies, cell phone snatches, and drug use on that forested parcel of land next to the dead end. There are also reports of house break ins. The criminals hide out there because of the isolation.

Opening 6th Street to vehicular traffic, along with some traffic calming installations to prevent big trucks from going all the way through the neighborhood would deter the crime by putting more eyes on the street and would be safer for the public. Also, we need more than one way out of our street in case of an emergency.
