I am submitting this letter on behalf of the Rhode Island Avenue Main Street program, managed by the Friends of Rhode Island Avenue NE, to express our support for the above-referenced application for the mixed-use development proposed at 4th and Rhode Island Avenue. We are very excited to see this underutilized shopping center become a vibrant and active development that contributes to the Edgewood community. I have attended several community meetings and have heard MRP's presentation on the proposal. The entire community will benefit from the addition of residential space, including a net gain of affordable units, where none existed before. Our organization is particularly excited for the proposed retail uses, including the grocery store, gym and movie theater, and believe that those uses will serve the existing residents in this area as well as the new residents that will be living in this project.
