My family is most excited about having a new grocery store and better retail that we can walk or bike to. We currently have to load our kids in the car and drive to Tenleytown or Cathedral Commons to shop for anything other than basic food needs.

Looking beyond my family, I see the larger benefits of this project for the District and Ward 3E, including:

- New housing options for aging neighbors looking to downsize and stay in the neighborhood.
- Expanded housing options for American University graduate students and visiting professors.
- Short-term construction jobs for District residents.
