Dear Members of the Zoning Commission,

At the Dec 7th public hearing for Z.C. Case 20-21, opponents to the case testified about their perceived lack of engagement by POAH with Barry Farm residents throughout this process. There were several inaccurate statements made about POAH and our community engagement efforts. These statements include that POAH does not provide project updates to Barry Farm Residents and that POAH does not make themselves available to talk with residents. POAH would like to provide additional information to address these inaccuracies.

In addition to the 125 letters previously submitted in the case record, and to further illustrate our continued level of engagement and resident support, attached are additional letters from former Barry Farm residents that describe their level of engagement and interaction with the Barry Farm team. Also attached are the newsletters from the past few months that include project updates and resources.

We provide quarterly project updates to residents on project status (which have been virtual throughout COVID). Additionally, we have regular (monthly or bimonthly) events to keep residents engaged, build community, and share resource information; this has included meetings with other partners such as DC Housing Authority (DCHA), the Office of the Deputy Mayor for Planning and Economic Development (DMPED), Far SE Family Strengthening Collaborative. Our most recent Barry Farm Meeting was March 30th, a <u>Virtual Resource Fair</u> to connect residents with service providers. Some residents have communicated that being offsite and away from their former networks has been challenging, so the activities that our team hosts serve not only to keep POAH connected with residents, but also to keep residents connected with other residents. A great example of community building is our <u>Resident Virtual Holiday Party</u> that took place December 2020. We have also attached to this letter a list of the engagement events hosted to date with Barry Farm residents and other key stakeholders.

POAH has continued our engagement efforts, even during COVID, to ensure that all residents have accurate and up-to-date information about the redevelopment process. Our Community Impact Manager, Tanya Phillips, conducts outreach to residents to ensure they are receiving the resources they need while offsite and resources they need to prepare to return. Our efforts are geared to promoting stability, wealth-building and community-building, as we want ALL Barry Farm residents to be successful throughout and beyond redevelopment.

POAH views this redevelopment as more than just constructing new buildings — as an organization, we are committed to helping residents reach economic and social stability in their lives. We understand the impacts that COVID-19 has had on the community, and our team has been there over the past year supporting residents by providing food, personal protective equipment, laptops and/or tablets, and gift cards to ensure that residents continued to thrive during an unprecedented time.

We hope you see that the POAH team is fully committed to the Barry Farm Redevelopment and, more importantly, to residents returning to the site so that they can take advantage of the benefits that will result from this redevelopment.

Development Update

Infrastructure 1A Sumner Road work continues to progress. The construction team

continues to install new pipes and structures for water/sewer and other utilities. This road will lay the foundation for the first two new buildings. The team is preparing financing applications and packages for the first building (**Building 1B**) as we are hopeful for a fall 2021 financing closing and construction start.

There will be a **Map Public Hearing** on **Monday, May 3 at 4 pm**. The Office of Planning has filed applications for Map/Text Amendment to create the Barry Farm Zone.

If zoning advances, we will reach out to general contractors, subcontractors and residents with employment opportunities for **Building 1B**. 

POAH's Managing Director, Real Estate Development Rodger Brown also provided testimony to support the project moving forward through the zoning process. The Zoning Commission elected to hold on taking action on the amendment until February, 2021 when the Map Amendment hearing occurs and at which point they are able to obtain additional information from the Office of Planning and City Council about the approval of the City's Comprehensive Plan.

Project Updates, Unity Day and Road Closures

As the summer comes to a close, POAH is excited to share recent events and what's happening this fall at **Barry Farm**:



Historic Preservation and Demolition on Site

In January 2020, the **Historic Preservation Review Board** voted to designate five buildings at **Barry Farm** as **Historic Landmarks**. Since the designation, the development team has worked to secure and stabilize the **five buildings** from further deterioration by boarding all openings, repairing damaged roofs and enclosing the buildings with fencing with locked gate access.

The **development team** will launch a **steering committee** in the fall of 2020 to begin discussions with the community on how to best integrate the **landmarked buildings** into the redevelopment in a manner that properly showcases the buildings and the historic **Barry Farm** community's contribution to the fabric, culture and history of the city.

Demolition efforts continue on the remaining 61 buildings that have not been landmarked. As of early September 2020, only two buildings remain to be demolished and that work is expected to be completed by November.

Barry Farm Unity Day

On August 22, POAH coordinated a safe and socially-distant Unity Day for Barry Farm residents.

Families connected with the POAH team and received book bags and school supplies for the children along with face masks and hand sanitizer. In addition to distributing 130 backpacks, more than 150 hot meals were provided to residents.



The Junk Yard Band: A Pioneer Go-Go Band in Washington DC

The Junk Yard Band was formed in 1980 by children, ranging in age from 8 to 13, living in the **Barry Farm Housing Project**. They were inspired to play after witnessing the performances of local **Go-Go bands** in their neighborhood.

Not having resources to purchase traditional instruments, the children instead scoured their neighborhood in search of objects that could emulate the sound of real instruments: hubcaps, plastic buckets, crates, cans, and discarded pots and pans. These type of Go-Go bands were called "**Bucket Bands**".

After a few informal performances in **Barry Farm Public Housing**, the group was dubbed the Junk Yard Band by locals. This is perhaps a reference to the animated television program, **Fat Albert and the Cosby Kids**, whose band "**The Junk Yard Gang**" also performed on improvised instruments. This band is still performing today and recently presented at an **Anacostia Community Museum** program. Go to http://junkyardband.us/

Historic Preservation Review Board in favor of POAH's continuing progress on Barry Farm legacy plan - next meeting is in January

POAH and the District of Columbia Housing Authority (DCHA) went before the Historic Preservation Review Board (HPRB) Dec. 5 to advance the redevelopment of Barry Farm. The focus was on identifying pathways to continue the project which will recognize the strong



cultural legacy of **Barry Farm** and bring significant public and private investment and new affordable housing that is safe, secure and accessible to low to moderate-income families.

Photo: Tony Waddell, POAH's Vice President, Real Estate Development Mid-Atlantic, answered the board's questions

The **Board, POAH** and **DCHA** are in agreement that there is a need for appropriate designation and representation of the historical importance of **Barry Farm**. **POAH** and **DCHA** presented site concept plans that create a "cultural district" at **Barry Farm**, and tie the development into the **Hillsdale/Anacostia heritage trail** – reconnecting it to the history of the larger original **Barry Farm** community and **Anacostia**.

These plans were developed in consultation with the **State Historic Preservation Office** (SHPO) and with additional input from the community - expanding upon previous plans that have been vetted and developed in consultation with the **Smithsonian Anacostia Community Museum** and other community stakeholders over the past two years. Included in those plans is a process in which the history of **Barry Farm** is permanently recorded in the annals of the **Library of Congress**.

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The **HPRB** provided directional guidance and asked that plan details be worked through and presented at the **January meeting**. This is another successful step in moving the process forward and moving closer to returning **Barry Farm** residents to the

community with supportive services geared toward creating stability and economic mobility, and bringing economic growth opportunities to **Ward 8** and the **District of Columbia**.

Following the **Historic Preservation Review Board** hearing, **POAH** and **DCHA** are pleased that the Board has recognized the joint efforts **POAH and DCHA** have made to strengthen historic preservation at Barry Farm while also protecting the residents' rights to safe, secure, accessible and affordable housing.

POAH and DCHA will continue working with all stakeholders, including the residents of **Barry Farm**, community organizations, cultural historians and DC's preservation office to find innovative ways to celebrate the history and legacy of Barry Farm. **POAH and DCHA** look forward to bringing the redevelopment plan to reality ensuring a vibrant community as soon as possible for residents who are eager to return home.



Historic Preservation Review Board postpones vote on Historic Landmarking of Barry Farm to December 5

Dear Barry Farm Residents and Friends,

At its Oct. 31 meeting, the **Historic Preservation Review Board** decided to postpone the next action on the redevelopment of Barry Farm to December 5.



POAH's community-backed plan was put on hold when the **Barry Farm Tenants and Allies Association** and **Empower DC** filed a request with the Board to designate the remaining buildings at the site as historic landmarks.

Historic designation would result in delays in the return of Barry Farm residents to their homes and a cut in the number of affordable housing apartments that will be created.

Photo: Barry Farm residents were in the audience to show their support for moving the redevelopment forward. Tony Waddell, POAH's Vice President, Real Estate Development, Mid-Atlantic, explained how historic landmarking would delay the project.

The history of Barry Farm is important, and its legacy will be preserved and honored in the plans for the redevelopment **but it should not be at the**

expense of the residents' rights to return as quickly as possible to safe, secure, affordable, and accessible homes.

The board directed **POAH**, **DCHA** and other interested parties to continue working on the existing plan to produce the highest number of affordable and public housing units while highlighting the history of the original Barry Farm **before the next board meeting on December 5**.
