I moved to Cleveland Park a few years ago because I wanted to live in a convenient, walkable neighborhood on the Red Line. Between the retail on Connecticut Ave and all the easily accessible transit, I've been able to work full time and raise my toddler here without a car. I'd love to see even more exciting options within a few blocks of my house — and like many neighbors, I'm worried about all the empty storefronts, especially since the Target closed. I feel strongly that we need zoning changes to encourage investment in the Cleveland Park commercial strip, and I'm particularly excited about allowing taller buildings, removing the limits on food & beverage establishments, and enabling second-floor retail. Building denser housing is also a great way to help local businesses thrive. What business wouldn't benefit from having dozens of potential customers right upstairs?

I know many other young families who would love to live here but are currently priced out. If we had a more diverse housing stock — and simply more housing overall — then the convenient, walkable lifestyle my family enjoys could be within reach for more people.
