On behalf of the Capitol Hill Restoration Society, I would like to make a preliminary request to participate in the hearing on the Connecticut Avenue Corridor case specifically with regard to the creation of new overlay districts. The Capitol Hill Restoration Society does not claim any special interest in or expertise in the rezoning of the Connecticut Avenue Corridor. However, we do have a long-standing interest in the integrity of the zoning regulations, and are interested in the concept of the creation of multiple local overlay districts.
