Specifically, the Cleveland Park Historical Societies' request for downzoning of this area; and, the movements by the Urban Group for development of this area with a possible request to increase the zoning limits which are now in effect.

In consideration of the hearing scheduled for January 14, 1988, I would like to go on record in support of the Cleveland Park Historical Societies' request for downzoning.
