I am writing to urge you to vote to change the zoning of the Cleveland Park district to a historical district designation,

As a resident of the area I am concerned about the traffic, pollution and parking problems that would result with the construction of high rise buildings. Already it is extremely difficult to park and greater building density would make it almost impossible. As it is I often have to park six blocks from my apartment. Already there are activities such as the movie house and the Kennedy Warren dance hall, and zoo ~~that~~ crowd the neighborhood with non residents. To further the problem will in the long run run the residents who love and care about the area "out to the suburbs" and leave the area to the developers. I do not feel that this is in the best interest of the city, as these very residents are the ones that fight to keep the city habitable.

I hope that you will see the necessity of voting for the Cleveland Park/Woodley Park area historical districts and preserve the beauty and relative tranquility of the area that has made this part of the city a place of enjoyment for ALL district residents who patronize our movies, restaurants and shops.
