Because of my concern regarding the recently filed PUD application for the development of the Park & Shop at Ordway and Connecticut and because of the adverse impact that this would have on the neighborhood now and in the future, I attended the Zoning Commission meeting held January 14.

After hearing the zoning overlay proposal by the Office of Planning, it was my consensus that the proposal was very much in agreement with the Cleveland Park Historical Society and the ANC 3C proposal to limit massive large scale development in an effort to prevent traffic congestion and not add to the area's parking problems. The neighborhood is NOT against development or revitalization but would like to limit development to insure it remains a neighborhood.

It is my hope that the Commission will vote to limit large developments in this area and that the regulations will be written in a consistant manner so that developers now and in the future will be aware of the limitations and not try to skirt them, especially by filing PUD applications.
