The 3801 Connecticut Tenants Association strongly supports the petition (Case 86-26) to change the zoning of our Connecticut Avenue neighborhood.

We believe the developer's plan to build a huge building on the Park & Shop site would ruin our lively community -- an agreeable, ethnically diverse neighborhood of young, middle-aged, and elderly citizens living close to a variety of small shops and restaurants. Small is not necessarily beautiful, but here at least smallness is an essential element of the neighborhood's vitality.

Large-scale development would drive many of our present residents to slums or suburbs; block enterprising but short-of-cash persons from opening the kinds of small businesses that now characterize the area; leave us desperately short of parking space; and make our often clogged traffic even more frustrating and dangerous.

We are counting on you to protect our neighborhood.
