I have been a resident of Cleveland Park for two years. One of the things that drew me to this neighborhood was its residential quality. I do not find high-rise apartment buildings and large commercial buildings to be very residential nor in character with the neighborhood. I think that the Historic District designation should have enough significance so that historic buildings are preserved and any new commercial development is consistent with the character of the neighborhood. I do not want my neighborhood to look like Van Ness, which is far more developed and far less charming than Cleveland Park.

I oppose the development proposal at the Park & Shop site and support the commercial downzoning of Cleveland Park.
