Nevertheless, some animals are killed by speeding cars. Also, some senior citizens have been both killed and injured at Connecticut Avenue and Porter Street. The traffic is so heavy.

The new, proposed development in that area, on Connecticut Avenue would make the traffic too much to bear - killing more people and animals. I am not a senior citizen but am afraid every time I cross the Connecticut Avenue - Porter Street corner.
