Dear Chairman Williams and Members of the Commission:

As Coordinator for the testimony of the Woodley Park Community Association ("WPCA") regarding Z.C. Case No. 86-26, I am writing to you to request that WPCA be permitted to enter into the official record information in addition to that specifically requested by the Zoning Commission. The purpose would not be to re-address issues already presented, either in writing or orally, by WPCA to the Zoning Commission. Rather, we would appreciate the opportunity to add to the official record our views on matters which were addressed subsequent to our presentation. For example, the Zoning Commission requested that the law firm testifying against the Woodley Park Overlay Zone submit alternatives to the Overlay Zone. Should these be submitted by February 12, 1988, we would like to add WPCA's analysis for the record so that the Zoning Commission might have a fuller opinion, a community view, to consider during its later deliberations.

The effect of closing the official record for Z.C. Case 86-26 may have been broader than intended. Our request would not interfere with the Zoning Commission's proposed schedule. Additional WPCA comments would be submitted by the February 19, 1988 closing date announced. Specific information requested from WPCA, e.g., the number of official alley openings from Woodley Place, N.W. in Square 2204, would be submitted by February 12, 1988. Our understanding is that a record in a rule-making procedure is typically left open beyond the close of verbal testimony scheduled. Our intent is to present, within the February 19, 1988 closing, appropriate, additional WPCA comment to provide a broader, community representative view for the Zoning Commission's later deliberations.
