The imminent closing of the Safeway store in the 3400 block of Connecticut Avenue has made me understand the importance of the Zoning Commission.

My neighborhood needs immediate protection from high-rise development. I feel strongly that only neighborhood stores should be allowed. Having grown up in Washington and watched many improvements over the years, I am horrified that Cleveland Park might become like Van Ness or Wisconsin Avenue rather than changing in a thoughtful livable manner.

My neighborhood is residential, with shops that serve the people who live here and those who come to visit with a purpose (such as seeing the zoo). I very much want this flavour to be retained.
