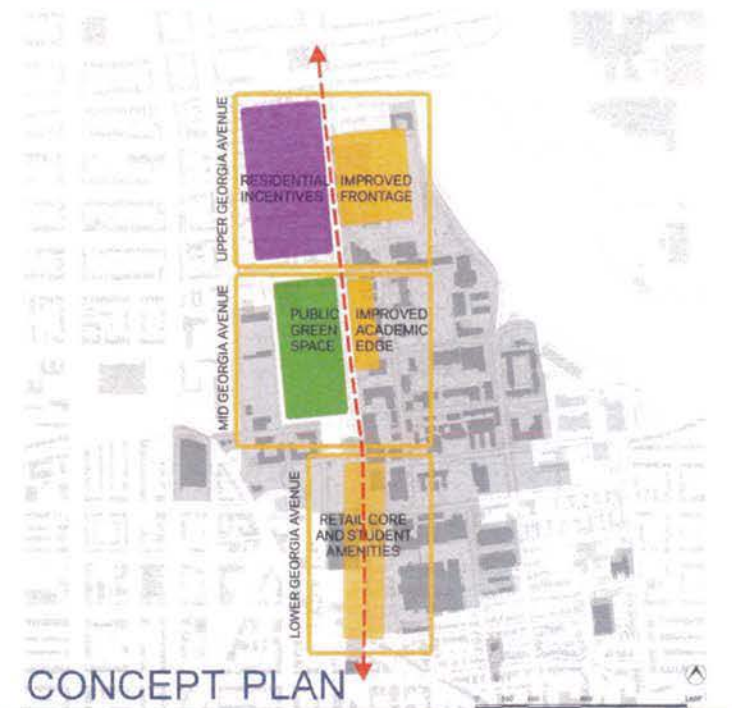
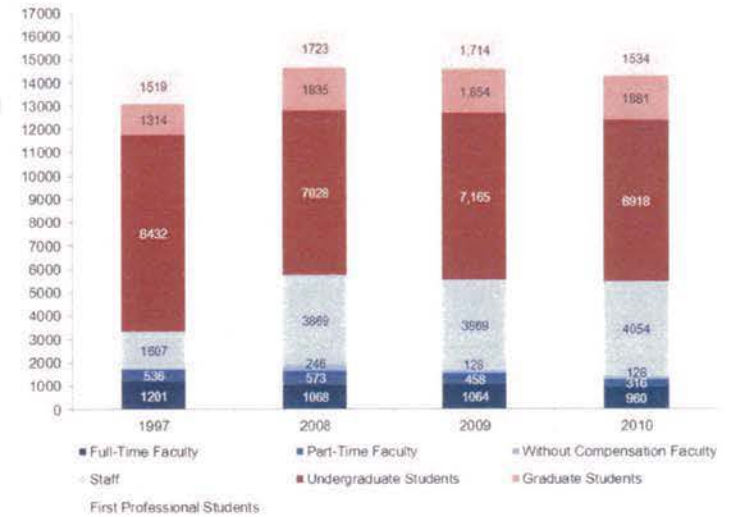

Mid Georgia Avenue

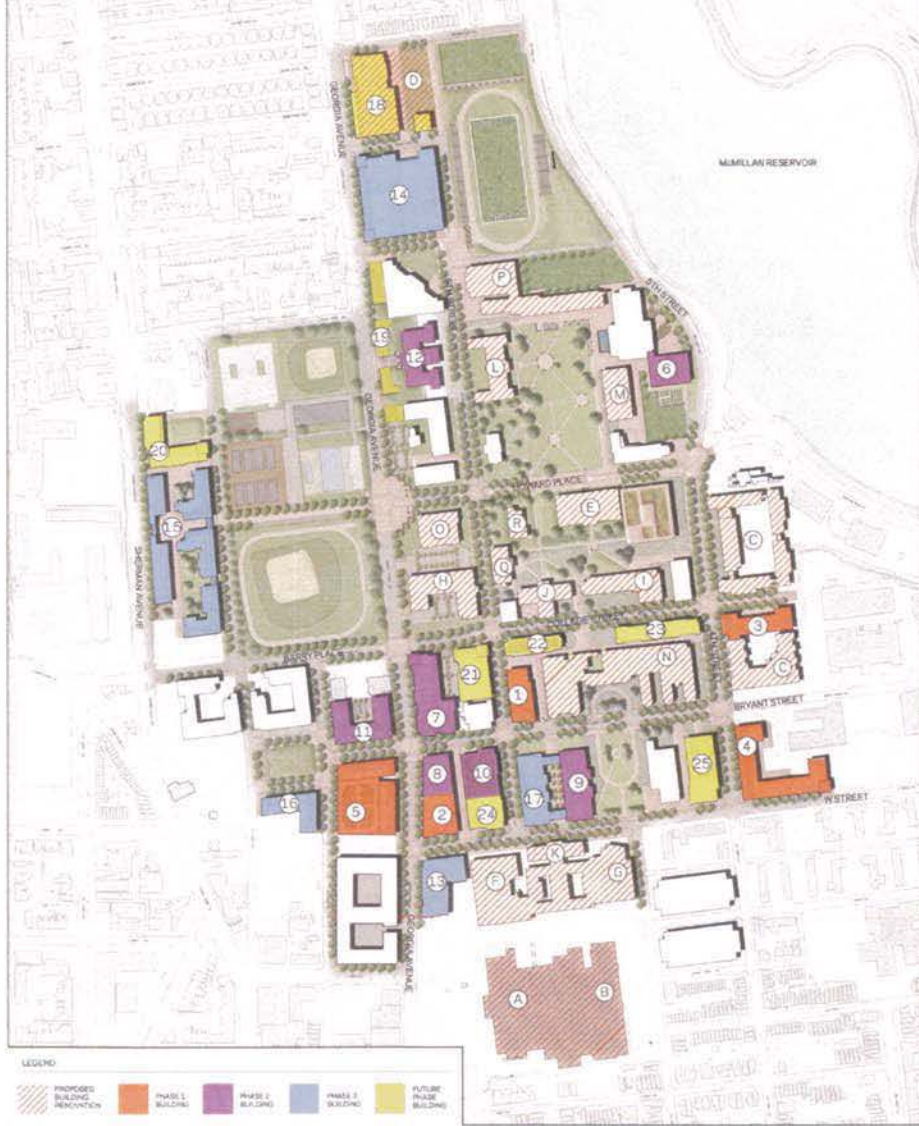
